*Born in Saint Germain-en-Laye, France on Feb 3, 1911, Jehan Alain was a well-known keyboardist and composer whose works were influenced heavily by early music (including Gregorian Chant) and jazz. In 1939, French publishers Éditions Alphonse Leduc issued Alain's "Trois Pièces," three short pieces for organ: Variations sue un theme de Clément Jannequin, Le jardin suspendu, and Litanies. Le jardin suspendu is prefaced with the text "the ideal, perpetual pursuit and escape of the artist, an inaccessible and inviolable refuge." The middle section of the piece features a melodic stopped flute at 5 1/3' (which Alain notates as Gros Nazard). This unique stop, combined with a 4' flute creates an eerie and hollow sounding voice that snakes around the repeated opening theme in the left hand. The piece then closes with the opening 8' string theme that eventually fades. Following this piece, Alain writes: "When, in its distress, the Christian soul can find no more words to invoke God's mercy, it repeats endlessly the same litany...for reason has reached its limit; only faith can take one further." Which leads into the next movement of the Trois Pièces, Litanies. Alain was deployed as a motorcycle rider in the French army in World War II died in battle at the age of 29. He was later awarded the Croix de Guerre, a prestigious French military decoration. Álain's Le jardin suspendu and Langlais' 8 Pièces Modales come with extensive writings detailing themes of sacrifice, meditation, questioning, frustration, and a somewhat complex, yet faithful, relationship with the Divine.
